* Especially if you have a home built before 1997. If you suspect you have leaking HVAC Ducting you may want to have that repaired prior to blowing in more insulation.

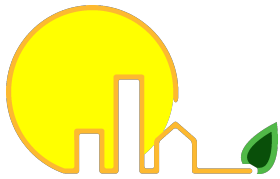
** If new windows are not in your budget, then definitely consider the Radiant Barrier Covering for the South and West facing windows, and install weatherstripping on doors and windows that have air leaks.

Many of these Energy Efficiency Upgrades are elegible for rebates and tax incentives. Talk to your local Building Department, your Utility, and of course your tax advisor. Most online DIY tax software includes tax deductions for some of these items.

Extra Ways to Save:

Program your thermostat to use less energy when you are away or sleeping. Install and use a water shut-off on your showerhead. Lower your water heater temp down to 130F and your refridgerator to 38F. Wash laundry in cool or warm water, avoid overdrying your clothes, and only wash full loads. If you have to replace your roofing, use a "Cool Roof" product.
